I cordally welcome everyone interested in the Korean Language Education Center (KLEC) at Secul National University's Language Education Institute (LEI).


Since its establishment in 1969, the KLEC at the SNU LEI has provided education in Korean

language and culture to foreigners, Koreans from abroad, and immigrants living in South Korea for

nearly half a century.

Each faculty member at the KLEC is a specialist majoring in Korean language education and related theories with a master's degree or higher degree, Our faculty members, who are South Korea's foremost experts in language education, endeavor to provide the best programs tailored to the diverse needs of foreign learners based on years of teaching experience and outstanding accomplishments in research on Korean language education.

The KLEC provides the best learning environment, from its modern educational facilities to convenient amenities, Surrounding a central garden featuring a unique Korean aesthetic, the two buildings house lecture halls with cutting-edge technology for multimedia classes, as well as libraries, after-class study rooms, common areas, and other amenities such as a coffee shop and a cafeteria.





The regular programs are regular year-long programs developed for learners who aim to learn communicative Korean language skills in an integrated course. The programs are tailored to foreigners, Koreans from abroad, and immigrants living in South Korea who intend to enroll in universities or graduate schools, engage in business, or find employment in South Korea through intensive study in Korean. The programs consist of six levels, ranging from Level 1 to Level 6, Students in each level will enhance their ability to communicate in Korean and participate in diverse cultural experiences for 200 hours over a total of 10 weeks, Each class size is small, consisting of approximately 12 to 16 students. Scholarships are also awarded to outstanding students, Students registered in the regular programs may apply for the on-campus domittories and a General Training Visa (D-4).

In addition, advanced academic classes, which are for learners who have received Korean language education equal to Level 6 or above in terms of the regular programs or have an equivalent level of proficiency, allow students to acquire diverse language skills necessary for undergraduate and graduate courses while developing cultural awareness and professional language skills needed for work life.

* Guidelines for Regular Program Applicants

(1) Study Pla

You study plan should include why you applied for the Korean language program and your plans after completing the course in detail. The study plan must be written in either Korean, English, Chinese, or Japanese within one A4 page in free format

(2) Résumé (Curriculum Vitae) or Personal Statement

It should briefly state your academic background since high school and other achievements, Your résumé (curriculum vitae) or personal statement must be written in either Korean, English, Chinese, or Japanese within one A4 page in free format.

- (3) ① Scanned Version of the Official Certificate of Graduation from the Most Recently Attended Institution (Submit in either Korean, English, Chinese, or Japanese, Documents in other languages should be submitted with the scanned version of a notarized translation certificate and the original certificate of graduation.)
- ② Scanned Version of the Official Academic Transcript from the Most Recently Attended Institution (Submit in either Korean, English, Chinese, or Japanese, Documents in other languages should be submitted with the scanned version of a notarized translation certificate and the original certificate of graduation.
- ③ Apostille of the Graduation Certificate and Academic Transcript: The documents must be verified by the Korean Consulate if the applicant's country does not provide an apostille.
- * Documents Required for Chinese Students (This does not apply to students from Taiwan or Hong Kong.)

- 5) For Prospective High School Graduates (Not Applicable for Graduates): Submit scanned versions of the official certificate of expected graduation and the academic transcript after verifying the documents through the China Academic Degrees and Graduate Education Development Center (CDGDC) website (www.chsi.com.cn, www.cdgdc.edu.cn) or the Korean Consulate after notatizing the certificate.
- (4) Bank Statement (This is not required for students who do not need a D-4 visa.)
 ① The applicant's own bank statement, If the bank statement is under the applicant's parent's name, you should also submit a family relation certificate,
- ② The balance should be 10,000,000 KRW or higher, and the certificate should be issued within 30 days.
- *For Chinese Applicants: The funds must have been held for at least six months,
 *For Vietnamese Applicants: 1) Submit either a bank statement with the funds
 held for at least three months or a 2) Confirmation of Depositing Study Expenses
 *For Uzbekistan Applicants: Bank statement issued by a Korean financial
 institution in Uzbekistan, which shows that the funds have been held for at least
 three conditions.
- ③ The document should be submitted in Korean, English, Chinese, or Japanese, Documents in other languages should be submitted with the scanned version of a notarized translation certificate and the original document,
